


### Symptômes psychiques au cours des 4 dernières semaines






# Where we're stuck and moving forward

	stuck	moving forward
1	<b>public health</b> ignores sexual minority health (beyond HIV prevention)	recognize sexual minority health in health policy and data collection
2	LGBT community organizations do not engage in political activism against health inequality nor provide adequate services to the community	recognize LGBT health inequality as a political issue and agitate for health equality and adequate services
3	AIDS service organizations focus on HIV prevention or rebrand under gay health without actually taking up a broader health agenda or providing additional services	reflect on their disease-centered mandate & their proper relationship to sexual minority health
